

# What is HIV? What is AIDS?

- The Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) is a very dangerous germ.
   It causes the disease called the Acquired
   Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS).
- Unfortunately, there is no vaccine against HIV, and no cure for AIDS. Be careful not to become infected with HIV!
- People with HIV can live longer with medical treatment, and healthy living.



# How Is HIV Transmitted?

HIV is transmitted by contact with certain body fluids that contain the virus:

### Sexual secretions:

 Unprotected sex (vaginal, anal and oral sex) with someone infected with HIV

#### Blood:

- Using a needle that someone with HIV has used, as in IV drug injecting
- Cutting the skin with an instrument that has HIV-infected blood on it
- Receiving a blood transfusion contaminated with HIV
- $\bullet$  HIV passing from mother to baby while in the womb or during birth

### Breast milk:

 An HIV-positive woman passing the virus to her baby while breastfeeding



# What Happens in Your Body?

- HIV attacks the body's defense system that fights off germs that cause disease.
- When the defense system is destroyed, germs invade the body. The person develops the disease called AIDS.
- Signs of AIDS include severe diarrhea, fever, weight loss, cough and tuberculosis, fungal infections of the mouth, and skin diseases.
- Other diseases cause these same symptoms. The only way to know for sure is by being tested for HIV.

# How Is HIV <u>NOT</u> Transmitted?

- · Shaking hands, touching or hugging
- · Kissing on the cheeks or lips
- · Using the same eating utensils
- · Riding in buses or cars
- Swimming or bathing together
- Insect bites
- Using the same toilets
- Being together in the same room

All of these activities are without risk, because HIV cannot be transmitted by saliva, tears, sweat, urine, etc. HIV is only transmitted through sexual secretions, blood and breast milk.

### Prevention

## Sexual transmission:

- Learn to manage your sexual desires! Eliminate the risk of HIV by abstaining from sex before marriage!
- Correctly used, latex condoms can reduce the risk of HIV infection.

# Blood transmission:

- Do not share injecting drug needles.
- Do not cut or pierce the body with unclean instruments.



# THERE IS GOOD NEWS

If you have been given the red card of HIV/AIDS, there is still hope. Jesus cares about you and can give you a new life with peace, hope, and a future. He can help you make good life decisions. The Bible says that Jesus desires a relationship with each of us regardless of what a person has done or has been done to them. He offers salvation and eternal life to anyone who believes in him (John 3:36). Ask God to forgive your sin and make you a new person in Him. And when life on earth ends, you will spend eternity in heaven.
